In an era of increasing distrust of institutions, the challenges for medical education are huge.

Medical school must teach the importance of hypothesis testing, peer review, and critical analysis of research. The goals and processes of education and the values that must be emphasized in interactions with students should be reviewed, and a strong curriculum in the history of medicine is needed for a realistic appreciation for the potential, advances, and truths of science.

Students should be encouraged to develop curiosity and inquiry and to show reasoned doubt about what they read and hear. Medical schools should redouble their commitment to clarity and truth by emphasizing critical thinking & critical review of the literature and teach respect for one another, tolerating disparate views without creating unnecessary polarization.
