

## Unité 14 Les réponses courtes et les tags

*Communication interpersonnelle*

### Réponses brèves, pour répondre « oui » ou « non »

Is she in the room?	→	Yes she is/No she isn't
Was he ready?	→	Yes he was/No he wasn't
Have you finished?	→	Yes I have/No I haven't
Had they told you before they wrote?	→	Yes they had/No they hadn't
Will she call?	→	Yes she will/No she won't
Would you do it?	→	Yes I would/No I wouldn't
Can you speak Japanese?	→	Yes I can/No I can't
Do you like anatomy ?	→	Yes I do/No I don't
Did they catch their train?	→	Yes they did/No they didn't

### Question-tags : n'est-ce pas ?

- Après une phrase affirmative → **[auxiliaire + not + sujet]**
  - The surgeon has arrived, hasn't he?
  - She'll be here by 3pm, won't she?
  - They arrived yesterday, didn't they?
  
- Après une phrase négative → **[auxiliaire + sujet]**
  - You were not in the room, were you?
  - He hadn't finished, had he?
  - We never drink tea, do we?
  
- **Attention, l'intonation utilisée modifie complètement le sens :**
  - Si l'intonation est descendante : il s'agit d'une manie de langage.
  - Si l'intonation est montante : il s'agit d'une vraie question.

### Moi aussi / moi non plus

**So + auxiliaire + sujet** Ex : I love chocolate  
So do I!

**Neither + auxiliaire + sujet** Ex : She hasn't finished.  
Neither has he!

**Si!/mais si !** Why didn't you call me? I **did** (↘), but the line was busy.

**Ah bon !** The match was fantastic. Was it?

**Attention à l'intonation**, qui donne un sens différent selon qu'elle est ascendante ou descendante.

- Si l'intonation est descendante, il s'agit d'une manie de langage (n'est-ce-pas ?)



Ex. Nevertheless, there were no safety studies, were there? (le locuteur en est sûr, ce n'est pas une vraie question)

- Si l'intonation est montante, il s'agit d'une vraie question (vraiment ?, vous êtes sûr ?)



Ex. He believes in alternative medicine, doesn't he? (c'est une vraie question)
